Course objectives:

The aim is to provide a panorama of French culture both in its more formal and its more popular aspects. A special effort will be made to link the course content to the students' presence in Lyon/Rhône-Alpes region, thus providing an "applied culture" dimension to the course. To summarize, the goal is to instruct the students in French culture so as to make the stay as enriching and pleasant as possible. The class is a lecture class with frequent use of images and brief video excerpts.
